
LETTER TO THE GOVERNOR AND OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY

BOARD BACKGROUND, AUTHORITY AND FUNCTIONS

- The Board

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology was established in 1934 under Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code. The Board is composed of eleven members who are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Ohio Senate. The Board is a diverse group of persons, geographically representative of the Cosmetology industry, Cosmetology Educational programs, Cosmetology Salons, Medical Practice, and the public. The composition of the Board is as follows:

- (1) One individual holding a current, valid cosmetologist or cosmetology instructor license at the time of appointment;
- (2) Two individuals holding current, valid cosmetologist licenses and actively engaged in managing beauty salons for a period of not less than five years at the time of appointment;
- (3) One individual who holds a current, valid independent contractor license at the time of appointment and practices a branch of cosmetology;

- (4) One individual who represents individuals who teach the theory and practice of a branch of cosmetology at a vocational or career-technical school;
- (5) One owner or executive actively engaged in the daily operations of a licensed school of cosmetology;
- (6) One owner of at least five licensed salons;
- (7) One individual who is either a certified nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist holding a current, valid license to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code or a physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery;
- (8) One individual representing the general public;
- (9) One individual who holds a current, valid tanning permit and who has owned or managed a tanning facility for at least five years immediately preceding the individual's appointment;
- (10) One individual who holds a current, valid esthetician license and who has been actively practicing esthetics for a period of not less than five years immediately preceding the individual's appointment.

No more than two members, at any time, shall be graduates of the same school of cosmetology. Each member serves a five-year term. Members are paid for each day employed in the discharge of official duties. All members are reimbursed according to state travel rules for travel expenses. The current membership is:

Dr. Shalini Gupta served as the physician member on the Board throughout FY 2017, resigning her position effective May 9, 2017. Dr. Gupta began her term on the Board on May 2, 2013. The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is required to meet at least four time each year, but normally meets on a monthly basis. In addition to regular Board meetings, the Board has established several committees to improve efficiency and focus the board to address specific actions and recommendations. Among these are:

1. Curriculum Review Committee – The Curriculum Review Committee is tasked with reviewing each of the educational programs required for cosmetology and each branch of cosmetology. Educational curriculums are reviewed to assure the programs provide the coursework necessary for students to take and pass the minimal competency examination for each type of license issued by the Board. The Committee recommends the new curriculums to the Board for approval.

2. **Administrative Review Committee** – one Board member who works with staff and legal counsel to review complaints and investigations staffs the Administrative Review Committee. The Administrative Review Committee is charged with determining if the findings of an investigation warrant the issuance of a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing, if the matter should be dismissed as non-jurisdictional to the agency’s authority, or because the allegations were unfounded. Additionally, the Administrative Review Committee routinely reviews settlement agreement conditions, proposed Notices of Opportunity for Hearing to determine if the inspection report findings correlate to violations alleged in the notice, and other actions taken by the Board.
3. **Rules Review Committee** – the Rules Review Committee is tasked with meeting with staff to consider new, amended, or proposed rescinded rules. The committee may accept, reject, or modify staff recommendations and propose rules to the full Board for consideration. The process provides an efficient review that streamlines drafting processes and results in rules that are better formulated.

- Function

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is a multi-dimensional agency that is responsible for the licensing of individuals engaged in providing cosmetology services or branches of cosmetology services (e.g. Manicuring, Esthetics, Hair design, and Natural Hair Styling). The Board also licenses salons engaged in retail cosmetology services, branch of cosmetology services, and tanning services. The Board is responsible for the licensure of schools of cosmetology, which designed to prepare persons for careers in cosmetology or its branches.

In 2016, pursuant to Am. Sub. S.B. 213, the Board began issuing permits to persons engaged in limited services, called “boutique services.” Additionally, the Board began issuing Boutique Services salon licenses to businesses engaged in the provision of boutique services.

In addition to its licensing duties, the Board routinely inspects businesses and schools engaged in the provision of cosmetology services, branches of cosmetology, and tanning facilities. Inspectors issue reports in real-time using a web-based inspection system. Violations are noted and salons/tanning facilities are required to post their inspection findings in a conspicuous place that is accessible to the public. Inspectors may issue a warning for some violations, based upon guidance established by the Board that takes into consideration the criticality of the violation. Other findings may result in the issuance of a formal Notice of Opportunity for Hearing issued under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Additionally, the Board also receives and processes complaints from the public. Complaints may result in a formal investigation or follow-up inspection depending upon the nature of the complaint. An investigation may also lead to the issuance of a formal Notice of Opportunity for Hearing issued under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. In all respects, persons (including individuals, salons, schools, or tanning facilities) alleged to have committed a violation of Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code, or rules thereunder, are afforded an opportunity to be heard under the provisions of law.

Following an adjudication hearing held pursuant to Chapter 119 of the Revised Code, the Board may act against a licensed cosmetologist, manicurist, esthetician, hair designer, or natural hair stylist, related salon, schools, and/or tanning facility licensed by the Board. Within the parameters of the law, the Board may deny, suspend, or revoke a license. Additionally, the Board may also levy fines.

If a person or facility is found practicing without a license, permit, or registration, the Board may seek an injunction or appropriate restraining order for such practice in the county where the violation occurred. The Office of the Ohio Attorney General, upon the Board's request, may pursue appropriate relief through the court of common pleas in the county in which the violation occurred.

Official actions of the Board are journalized in the minutes of each meeting. In FY 2017, the Board held twelve regular meetings. Board meeting minutes are available to the public by mail, electronic mail, and a full year or more of minutes are maintained on the Board's website. The Board disseminates information concerning its activities, forms, notices, and Board member profiles on its state webpage: www.cos.ohio.gov.

- Funding

The Board is self-sustained through fees generated from applications for initial licensure, renewal fees, fines, and other miscellaneous sources. Most of the Board's fees are deposited into the Occupational and Professional Licensing Fund (called the "4K9" fund) consisting of revenue from twenty-seven commissions and professional licensing boards. Persons restoring an expired license are required to submit a lapsed license fee, which shall be deposited to the General Revenue Fund. Each agency in the fund is required to generate sufficient revenue to meet its own expenses. Although the 4K9 fund serves as the funding source for the Board, it is not a rotary fund and the Board is funded through the standard biennial budget process. Hence, the Ohio General Assembly establishes the Board's biennial budget. Each year, the Board reviews licensure fees and budget requirements to determine if fee adjustments are necessary.

- Staffing

During FY 2017, the Board employed 39 full time staff and one intermittent staff to complete the work of the Board. The staff consists of one Executive Director 1.0 FTE, six exempt Supervisory/Administrative staff 6.0 FTE, eight Customer Service staff 8.0 FTE, six Examiners 6.0 FTE, twelve field Inspectors 12.0 FTE, three Administrative Action staff 3.0 FTE, and three administrative/fiscal staff 3.0 FTE. The office is located at 1929 Gateway Circle, Grove City, Ohio. The agency business hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

FY 2017 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND STATISTICS

In fiscal year 2017, the Board was able to conduct its business during one-day meetings. Meeting dates are posted on the Board’s website and meeting notices and agendas are posted no less than five days prior to a scheduled meeting. Following Board approval at each meeting, the minutes are posted to the agency’s website for public review. Like most meetings, the Board’s business agenda follows a regular process that includes approval of prior meeting minutes, officer, and staff reports, committee meeting reports, new business, and old business. As required, the Board must also address administrative matters under Chapter 119 of the Revised Code, including administrative disciplinary hearings.  - The Board reviewed two proposed rules that were filed with JCARR. After discussion, the Board approved a motion to amend and refile rule 4713-7-09, based on testimony provided.
- **In April 2017:**
- The Executive Director reported on the 2017 renewal cycle and provided the Board with recommendations for improvement in the process. No action was taken.
 - The Board approved a revision to policy 2.23, the Salon application processing policy. Additionally, the Board approved policy 3.25, Unauthorized Weapons policy.
 - The Board approved a resolution delegating the authority to develop and administer licensing examinations.
 - The Board approved revisions to applications COS-058, COS-061, COS-057, COS-028, and COS-052 by removing the notary requirement. Additionally, the Board approved a motion to remove the notary requirement from all salon applications.
- **In May 2017:**
- The Board heard public testimony from a representative of Massage Envy concerning the use of chemical peel solutions with a pH below 3.0.
 - The Board reviewed a report from the Executive Director summarizing esthetics chemical peel regulations throughout the United States.
 - The Board approved a resolution on the number of internship hours that the Board would recognize toward total program clock-hour requirements.
 - The Board approved the following draft rules for filing with the office of Common Sense Initiative and JCARR:
- 4713-6-02 Eligible participants.**
- The Board approved two agency policies: policy #3.26 Active aggressor policy and policy #3.27 Workplace investigation policy.

- The Board approved two forms for internship enrollment and internship recognition of hours.
 - The Board reviewed a list of recommended amendments addressing language contained in S.B. 129 and H.B. 189 prepared by the Executive Director. After considering the recommendations presented, the Board approved the recommendations as the official recommendations of the Board on the two bills.
- **In June 2017:**
- The Executive Director reported on the agency budget, noting the agency would complete the fiscal year under budget. The Executive Director also reported on the biennial budget.
 - The Board discussed rule 4713-8-04 and the testimony and research presented concerning prohibiting the use of chemical peels solutions with pH values less than 3.0. The Board also read testimony submitted by Dr. Gupta concerning the use of chemical peel solution with a pH less than 3.0.
 - The Board approved the following draft rules for filing with the office of Common Sense Initiative and JCARR:
 - 4713-15-17 Rooms used for massage therapy, cosmetic therapy, or other professional services.**
 - The Board approved the Executive Director’s annual performance review.
 - The Board approved revising the Violation Guidance Matrix, representing agency policy on the enforcement of provisions of Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code and rules adopted under Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code.
 - The Board approved three new or revised records retention schedules.

Education

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is responsible for licensing private and career technical educational programs that offer training in cosmetology or branches of cosmetology. Schools in Ohio offer training in Cosmetology, Manicuring, Esthetics, Hair design, and Natural Hair Styling.

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is responsible for the licensing of schools of cosmetology offering education in cosmetology or its branches. Three distinct types of schools offer educational programs: Adult Education – Career Technical Schools, Career Technical Schools, and Private Schools.

Career Technical Schools are affiliated with the public-school system offering a comprehensive approach completing both primary education requirements and training in technical theory and practical skills in cosmetology or branches of cosmetology. Adult Education programs through a Career Technical School, on the other hand, are programs offered by the Career Technical School as an afterhours program for adult learners returning to increase their skills in a specific career track, such as cosmetology or its branches.

Private Schools are proprietary systems offering to provide education and training in technical theory and practical skills in cosmetology or branches of cosmetology. The National Accrediting Commission of Cosmetology Arts and Science (NACCAS) accredit most of these schools; however, accreditation is not a specific requirement under Ohio laws and rules.

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology currently licenses 88 Career Technical Schools, 20 Adult Education programs, and 68 Private Schools.

Programs taught include:

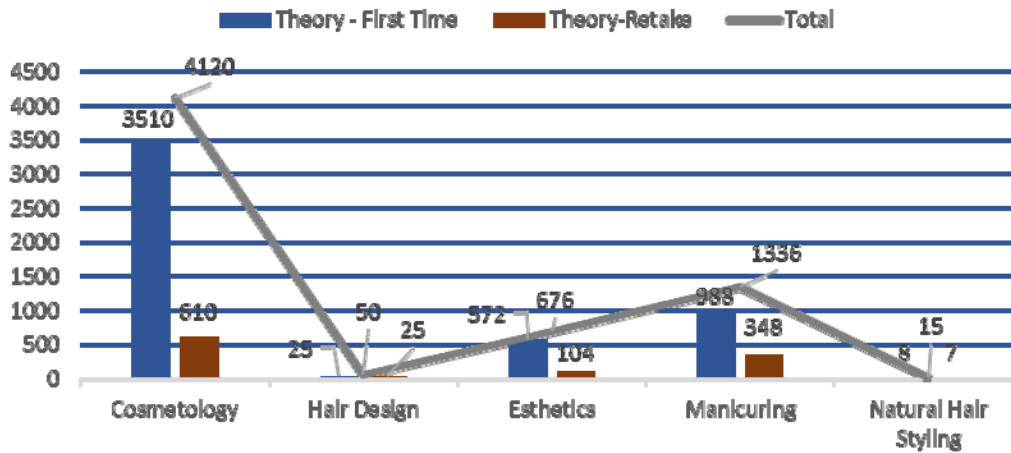
- (1) Cosmetology, which includes all branches of cosmetology.
- (2) Esthetics, which includes the application of cosmetics, tonics, antiseptics, creams, lotions, or other preparations for skin beautification and includes preparation of the skin by manual massage techniques or by use of electrical, mechanical, or other apparatus.
- (3) Hair design, which includes embellishing or beautifying hair, wigs, or hairpieces by arranging, dressing, pressing, curling, waving, permanent waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, braiding, weaving, or similar work. The practice of hair design also includes utilizing techniques performed by hand that result in tension on hair roots such as twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair.
- (4) Manicuring, which includes manicuring the nails of any person, applying artificial or sculptured nails to any person, massaging the hands and lower arms up to the elbow of any person, massaging the feet and lower legs up to the knee of any person, or any combination of these four types of services.
- (5) Natural hair styling, which includes utilizing techniques, performed by hand that result in tension on hair roots such as twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair.

During FY 2017, 17 cosmetology schools closed in the state of Ohio. Most were located in the Cincinnati/Dayton area of the state.

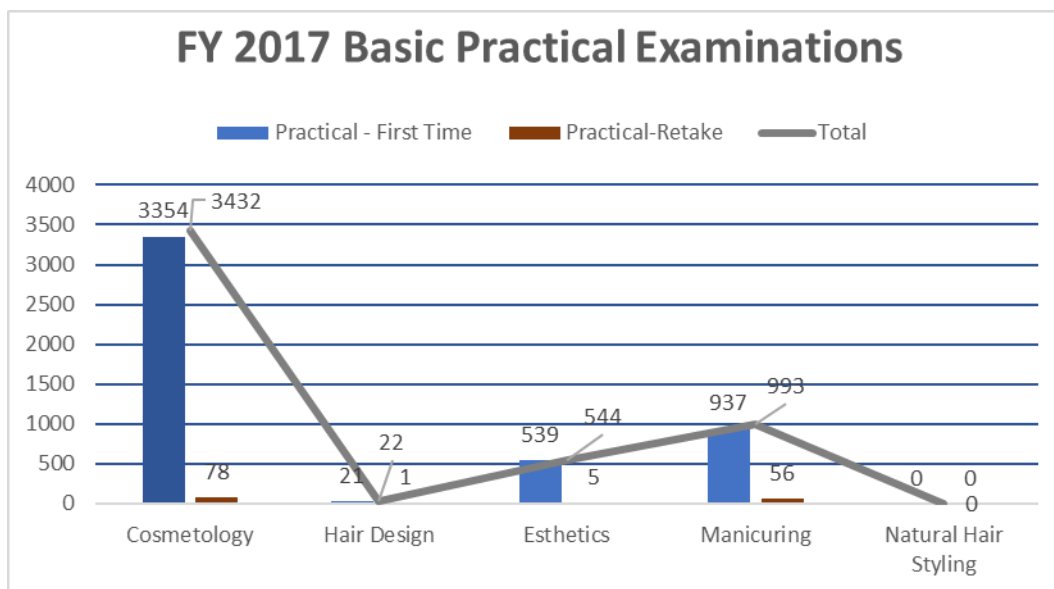
Examinations

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology develops and administers examinations in cosmetology and each specialized branch of cosmetology. Candidates are scheduled for examination throughout the year, resulting in approximately 30 – 50 candidates taking examinations each day of the week. Two basic examinations are administered for each discipline: (1) a computer-based theory examination that tests minimum competency on subject matter required to safely practice, and (2) a practical examination that tests hands-on technique used to competently render services, including applying infection control procedures. Upon completion and passing both the theory examination and practical examination, the Board issues a license on the same day the examinations were complete. This same day service allows licensees to enter their professional tracks immediately after successfully completing their competency examination for their intended careers. During FY 2017, the Board administered a total of 6197 theory-based examinations and 4991 practical examinations for cosmetology and specialized branches of cosmetology. The following represents the examinations scheduled and taken during FY 2017.

The combined average pass rate for all first-time examinees of the basic examinations is approximately 82%.

In FY 2017, the Board completed an update of the Manicuring theory examination and instituted five new advanced practice examinations in accordance with Am. Sub. S.B. 213. Am. Sub. S.B. 213 replaced the manager’s license with a new license called an “advanced” license. To address this change, the Board adopted rules that provided bridge approval to accept education completed in existing manager programs on or before the effective date of Am. Sub. S.B. 213. Based on data since the removal of the manager on-duty requirement, the number of persons testing for the advanced license has shown a downward trend. In FY 2016, the Board administered 3305 manager’s examinations. In FY 2017, the Board administered 1279 advanced practice examinations (including retakes of the examination) beginning on September 13, 2016. Extrapolating for the full fiscal year, the Board estimates a 51% decrease in the number of advanced practice examinations administered in FY 2017 compared to the number of manager examinations administered in FY 2016.

Licensure

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is responsible for the licensing of individuals engaged in providing cosmetology services or branches of cosmetology services (e.g. Manicuring, Esthetics, Hair design, and Natural Hair Styling). The Board licenses salons engaged in retail cosmetology services, branch of cosmetology services, and tanning services. The Board is responsible for the licensure of educational programs designed to prepare persons for careers in cosmetology or branches of cosmetology. In 2016, pursuant to Am. Sub. S.B. 213, the Board began issuing permits to persons engaged in limited services, called “boutique services.” Additionally, the Board began issuing Boutique Services salon licenses to businesses engaged in the provision of boutique services.

2017 Licensing Activity

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is responsible for the issuance and management of many professional licenses. Three primary practice licenses are issued to provide services in Cosmetology or any specific branch of cosmetology: Practice License, Advanced License, and/or an Instructor’s License. Additionally, the Board issues Independent Contractor licenses to persons that rent booth space in salons. Pursuant to Am. Sub. S.B. 213, the Board added a new salon type called a Boutiques Service Salon and added a no-cost registration for persons engaging in boutiques services, called a boutique services registration. The scope of services covered under the boutique services registration are shampooing, braiding, and threading.

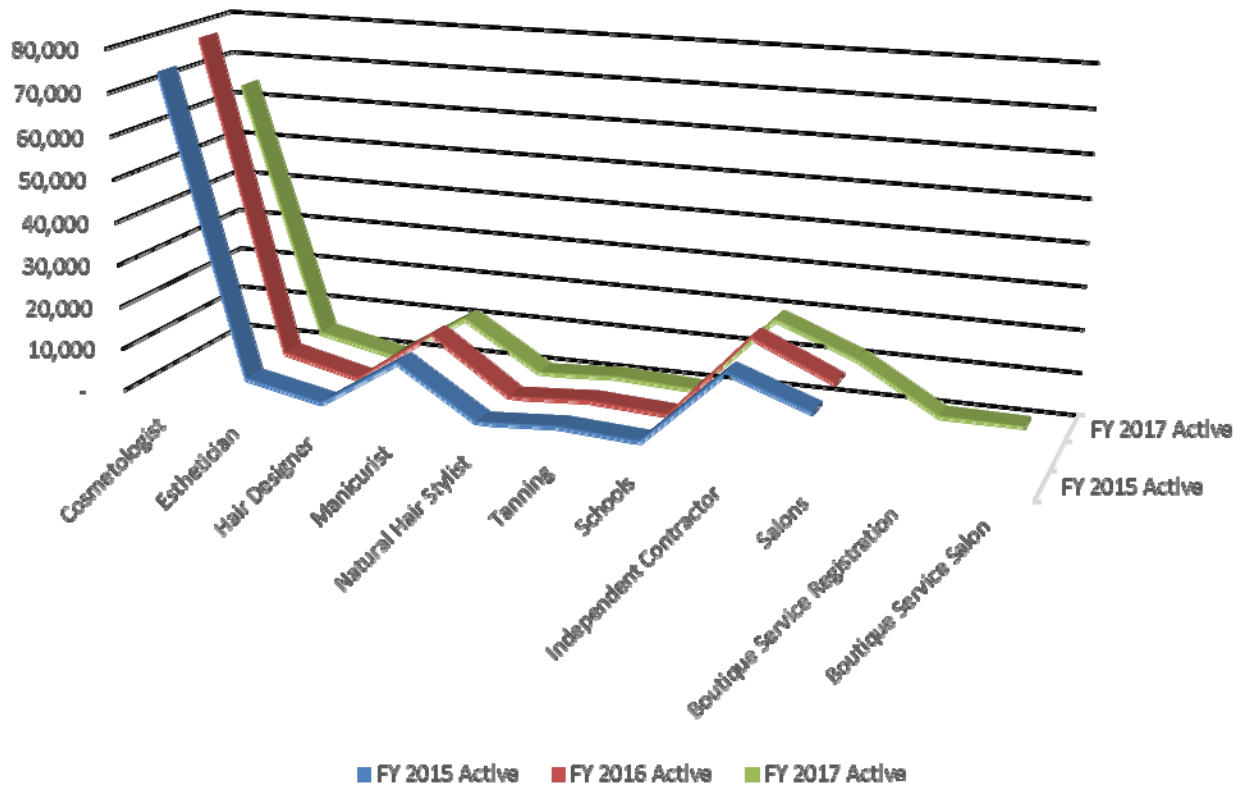
Salon and school licenses are issued by the Board and are designated according to the scope of practice rendered: Cosmetology, Esthetics, Manicuring, Hair Design, and Natural Hair Styling. Additionally, the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology issues permits to Tanning Facilities. Tanning facilities, pursuant to provisions of law, must restrict access based upon the age of the person seeking to use the tanning services. The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology develops consent forms, conforming to the Revised Code, which clearly state the risk factors associated with tanning and skin exposure to radiation produced by UV light sources used in tanning systems.

Year-to-year active license number comparisons are not an appropriate measure of trending due to the biennial renewal cycle. Therefore, it is best to consider comparisons to the last even or odd numbered year. Using the last odd numbered year (FY 2015) as a comparison, the total number of active licenses maintained by the Board decreased by 7.0%. Licensing activity for most license types remained constant or saw some growth. The greatest contributing factor to the decrease appears to be related to the renewal of advanced cosmetologist licenses. On September 13, 2016, in accordance with the provisions of Am. Sub. S.B. 213, persons holding an active manager license were issued an advanced license for the type of credential held. The Board issued 52,982 advanced licenses between September 13, 2016 and June 30, 2017; however, as of June 30, 2017, only 43,462 advanced cosmetology licenses remained active, indicating that more than 9500 persons did not renew this credential.

Inspections/Complaints/Administrative Action

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology is authorized under ORC 4713 to inspect facilities licensed by the Board. Additionally, the Board may investigate complaints filed by consumers. Pursuant to the findings of inspections, the Board may impose disciplinary action against providers, salons, schools, or tanning facilities for violating standards of practice in the provision of services. Hearings are held in accordance with Section 119. of the Revised Code. Alternative settlement agreements (Consent Agreements) are regularly offered in lieu of a hearing. Once approved by the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology, Settlement Agreements are entered upon the Board’s journal as an Order of the Board.

The Ohio State Board of Cosmetology employs one inspection supervisor who, under the supervision of the Executive Director, investigates complaints filed by consumers or salons in the state of Ohio. Additionally, the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology employs 12 field inspectors, who under the supervision of the Inspection Supervisor, conduct assigned and random inspections of cosmetology salons, branches of cosmetology salons (Manicuring salons, Esthetic salons, Hair Design salons, Natural Hair Styling salons, and Boutique Services salons), schools, and tanning facilities. Independent inspection findings can be issued directly to salons, independent contractors, and/or individual licensees or permit holders depending upon the inspection findings. Inspectors work from their home area and are assigned regional coverage areas. The three largest metropolitan areas are Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati.

In FY 2017, field inspectors issued 9,820 inspection reports, representing 8,071 salons visited (Cosmetology - 6387, Hair Design - 240, Esthetics - 548, Manicuring - 853, Natural Hair Styling – 11, and Boutique Services - 32), 849 Tanning facilities, 183 Schools, 704 individual licensees (basic cosmetology and branches of cosmetology licensees, advanced licensees, and independent contractors), and 13 unlicensed businesses. The Board issued 7200 approved (no violation) inspection reports. The Board issued 566 inspection reports citing violations of Ohio law or rule, resulting in a total of 685 violations and 710 inspection reports citing violations of Ohio law or rule, resulting in a total of 835 warnings. Inspectors also reported 1344 “no contact” inspections, meaning inspections were attempted but the facility was not open.

INDUSTRY OUTLOOK AND CONDITIONS

Effect of Gainful Employment Act on Cosmetology Education

In October of 2014 the U.S. Department of Education released the “gainful employment” rule, which was created to evaluate for-profit occupation schools or non-degree granting programs at community colleges that receive student financial aid funding. The rule evaluates each school’s graduate earning to debt ratio. If a school’s average graduate has loan repayments 30% above discretionary earnings or above 12% of the graduate annual earnings, the program is notified that they may be disqualified for future student financial aid funds. Schools under notice will be given two years to demonstrate improvement before being officially declared ineligible. Over the past year, a number of for-profit cosmetology programs have closed. These closures, as far as the Board is aware, are not directly attributable to any effect of the “gainful employment” regulations; however, the closures themselves do create potential graduate shortages that could be exacerbated by any impact of the gainful employment measures. Over the next few years, the Board will be monitoring the effect of gainful employment and its impact on the cosmetology workforce in Ohio.

Cosmetology/Barber Board Merger: Am. Sub. H.B. 49, effective July 1, 2017

Am. Sub. H.B. 49 merges the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology with the Ohio State Barber Board, effective January 21, 2018. The new agency will be called the State Cosmetology and Barber Board. The Board has developed an implementation plan to meet the deadline established by law. This merger will present opportunities for the two Boards to consolidate licensing and work processes. The Boards are cooperatively pursuing implementation solutions that will not only accomplish the required merger, but will also improve efficiencies of services offered.

Elicense 3.0

The Board, meaning the State Cosmetology and Barber Board is scheduled to join the new Elicense 3.0 licensing system, in spring 2018. The implementation process will consume significant agency time and resources to complete the system transition; however, the new system, once implemented, promises to greatly modernize and improve licensing services offered by the Board. The system is designed to provide virtual online services in an à-la-carte format for users seeking licensure or services with the Board.

Am. Sub. S.B. 213, Instructor Licensing

The Act requires the Board to create a curriculum and an examination for individuals seeking licensure as an Instructor within two years of the effective date of the Bill. Holding a valid Advanced Practice license is a prerequisite qualification for an instructor’s license. The Board’s current qualifications for an instructor’s license will remain in effect until the Board completes the new curriculum and examination over the next year.

CONCLUSIONS

The Board is an active state agency, representing approximately 112,000 individuals and businesses in the state of Ohio. Cosmetology and its associated arts are illustrative of a

vibrant, important contributor to private industry in the state of Ohio. The Board is continually challenging itself to provide services in a cost effective and efficient manner, holding individuals and business accountable for providing clean, safe services for Ohioans seeking quality beauty services. The Board will continue to learn from its experiences and apply regulatory efforts, within the jurisdiction and authority of Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code, that balance effective regulation against over-regulation that restricts business growth. The Board looks forward to working with Ohio’s policymakers to explore additional opportunities to create a better regulatory environment for the beauty industry in the state of Ohio.

A review of the Board’s records found 13 salons or individuals cited with more than one violation for unlicensed worker during the preceding 12 months. Accordingly, only 13 salons or individuals are being reported as all others had only a single violation in this category and could not be ranked within the top twenty.

X. The number of adjudications or other disciplinary action taken by the board:

During FY 2017, the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology held 7 hearings in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. 150 cases cited did not request a hearing before the Board, resulting in an Order entered upon the Board’s journal. 279 persons or salons entered into settlement agreements with the Board, which were approved and entered upon the Board’s journal as Orders of the Board.

XI. Recommendations the Board has for changes to O.R.C. Chapter 4713.

The Board approved the following recommended changes to Chapter 4713. of the Revised Code:

1. R.C. 4713.01
 - a. Eliminate the definition for “Practice of Braiding” and amend the definition of “Braiding” to include the additional information from “Practice of Braiding.” These changes would be beneficial since the term “Practice of Braiding” does not appear anywhere in statute. It would also be more consistent with the other boutique services, which are only defined as “Shampooing” and “Threading.”
 - b. Eliminate the definitions for “Advanced cosmetologist,” “Advanced esthetician,” “Advanced hair designer,” “Advanced manicurist,” and “Advanced natural hair

stylist,” and amend the definition of “Advanced license” to reference R.C. 4713.30. These changes would be beneficial because the definitions do not actually clarify or define the advanced licenses, and appear to place a restriction on the locations where these individuals are permitted to work.

2. R.C. 4713.07

- a. Replace the phrase “of which the board is aware” with the phrase “where applicable” in subsection (A)(7). This change would be more consistent with Board policies on pursuing criminal actions for violations.

3. R.C. 4713.08

- a. Remove the sentence “If one or more renewal periods have elapsed since the license was valid, the fee shall not include lapsed renewal fees for more than three of those renewal periods;” from subsection (A)(18)(a)(i). This language does not apply to inactive licenses, and should be placed in R.C. 4713.10(A)(11).
- b. Remove the sentence “The board shall consult with the Ohio department of health when establishing the sanitary standards.” from subsection (E). It is unnecessary for this to be mandated in statute.

4. R.C. 4713.10

- a. Add the sentence “If one or more renewal periods have elapsed since the license was valid, the fee shall not include lapsed renewal fees for more than three of those renewal periods;” to subsection (A), as noted above. This would be consistent with expressed legislative intent.

5. R.C. 4713.28

- a. Remove the phrase “licensed in this state” from subsections (A)(7), (A)(8), (A)(9), and (A)(10). This would remove barriers for individuals from other states in obtaining licensure in Ohio, and would be internally consistent with subsection (A)(11). It would assist Ohio students in obtaining licensure in other states by increasing reciprocity.

6. R.C. 4713.34

- a. Remove subsection (C), which only extends reciprocity to individuals from other jurisdictions that extend similar reciprocity to Ohio licenses. This language is problematic since there are very few, if any, formal reciprocity agreements in the cosmetology field. In addition, removing restrictions on reciprocity would assist Ohio students in obtaining reciprocity in other states.

7. R.C. 4713.44

- a. The Board should consider language amending the amount of the bond required by subsection (A)(8). Information would need to be obtained regarding industry standards on bond amounts, and the amount needed to adequately protect students.

8. R.C. 4713.55

- a. Remove the phrase “the type of salon in which the license entitles the holder to work and.” This change would avoid restriction on the locations where these individuals are permitted to work.
- b. Replace the phrase “the branch of cosmetology that the license entitles the holder to offer within a licensed salon” with the phrase “that the holder is only entitled to practice a branch of cosmetology within a licensed salon for which a current, valid license is held.” The current language is unnecessary since licensees holding an independent contractor license must also carry their practicing license.

9. R.C. 4713.61

- a. Remove the phrase “the later of the following” along with subsections (B)(1) and (B)(2), and replace it with “the individual holding the license submits proof satisfactory to the board that the individual has completed the continuing education that a rule adopted under section 4713.08 of the Revised Code requires.” This would eliminate an unnecessary and confusing time restriction, and would make it easier for licensees to remove their licenses from inactive status.

10. R.C. 4713.63

- a. Remove the sentence “The board shall deposit all fees it receives under division (B) of this section into the general revenue fund.” Division (B) of the section no longer references fees, and this sentence was inadvertently left.

11. R.C. 4713.69

- a. Remove subsection (A)(3), which requires boutique registrants to have the equivalent of an Ohio public school tenth grade education. This education requirement is unnecessary for boutique registrants. In addition, a large number of individuals who practice boutique services come from other countries where educational requirements differ, and where it may be difficult to obtain documentation.
